The proposed course Self Care Pharmacotherapeutics I is the first in a sequence of course that includes the first course listed PHA 742 Patient Assessment and Self Care. These two courses will now be a course sequence focused on over-the-counter medications and dietary supplements. A separate minor course modification is being submitted to change the name of PHA 742 to Self Care Pharmacotherapeutics II to reflect this course sequence. HLTH 200 includes dietary supplements as a component of the course, but it does not include over-the-counter medications. The proposed course will also have a focus on pharmacist evaluation of patients for appropriateness of self care therapies and patient education on use of over-the-counter products and dietary supplements.
