Opportunity for RNs Only

Interested in graduate nursing? Eligible RNs may request the opportunity to substitute two required MSN/DNP courses for two RN to BSN courses. Eligibility for RNs includes:

- MSN, 3.0 GPA + STAT 281, Statistics (or equivalent course) completed within five years of program start date
- DNP, 3.3 GPA + STAT 281, Statistics (or equivalent course) completed within five years of program start date

RN-MSN and RN-DNP students substitute two graduate nursing courses in place of two RN-BS nursing courses. Graduate nursing courses completed as part of the BSN:

- Foundations Advanced Nursing 3 credits (NURS 615) replaces NURS 454
- Research: Nursing/Health Care 3 Credits (NURS 626) replaces NURS 474

Formal graduate application is made prior to baccalaureate graduation.
