7. Explanation of the Change:

The Department of Health and Nutritional Sciences has identified the following changes to the Community and Public Health major:

1. The College of Education & Human Sciences will replace EHS 309 Interdisciplinary Group Processes (2 cr.) with EHS 319 Life, Love, and Money (2 cr.).
2. Remove HLTH 120 - Community Health and replace with the common course HLTH 320 Community Health to enable exploration of topics at a higher level than previously. Community Health is a key component of the major and the higher level course better meets competencies for the major.
3. Remove HLTH 230 – Stress Management for Life and list it as a highly recommended elective course depending on career focus. These 3 credits will be replaced by HLTH 322.
4. Add HLTH 322 – Public Health law to cover an area that has been lacking in curriculum for the major. Majors in the program need to be aware of various laws and legal practices that could impact their future career. This addition is a foundational knowledge for CEPH accreditation and at some point we are going to pursue accreditation of this program.
5. Remove HLTH 250 or HLTH 364 – First Aid & CPR or Emergency Medical Technician and list it as a highly recommended elective course.
6. Add NUTR 111 – Food, People & Environment to address food & nutritional needs across various cultures and environments. This course adds the components of global nutrition and health issues, as well as the principle of sustainability of food. In addition, the course provides a global perspective of various cultures thus bringing in another perspective of diversity to the major.
