**7. Explanation of the Change:**

The program has eliminated extraneous credits in practicum courses and added those experiences to the content related courses so that clinical experiences are more meaningfully tied to content. In addition, the changes in credits allow for more efficient use of faculty workload time by eliminating one credit courses. There was also careful consideration of skills the program desires from all candidates including inquiry and research. The common core of classes reflects the program desire to have a body of foundational knowledge consistent across all program tracks. Courses like EDER 612 Inquiry and Action Research (3 cr.) have been developed to reflect what is expected of current school leaders. Also, being able to offer course such as EDER 714 Advanced Educational Research Design and Analysis (3 cr.) will better prepare educational researchers. The program has been developed to better reflect expectations in the field of teacher education in the area of instructional and school leadership. In addition, the Department would like to add Option A – Thesis (30 credits) to the existing degree options for students who wish to pursue Ph.D. and Ed.D. degrees.
