- a minor, second major, or teaching specialization
- 6+ credits of Modern Foreign Language coursework, including completion of the 202-Level

Students interested in the Interdisciplinary Studies major must have a goal-based plan of study approved by the end of their first semester in the program. The plan must include 50% upper division credits. Prior credit may apply.

*Testing into a higher level language course may reduce time to graduation. To begin coursework above the 101 level, take the free modern language [placement test](#). Students with any modern language experience are strongly encouraged to complete the placement test.
