### **Academic Requirements:**

If a student chooses to double major in two majors offered through the Economics Department (Economics, Agricultural Business, Business Economics and Entrepreneurial Studies), the second major needs to have at least 18 credits that are distinct from the first major.

### 7. Explanation of the Change:

Existing Curriculum

The curriculum within the Economics major has not been updated in many years, and is in need of some slight modifications. The proposal updates the curriculum within the major, including the following:

- Expanding the choice of calculus courses to allow for a little more flexibility;
- Introduces a new capstone that will integrate theory and quantitative analysis to allow students to address real world economic problems. (request to offer new course included in

- a separate file). Previously ECON 423 Econometrics, a tools course, was listed as the capstone for the major.
- Introduces a policy requirement, and essential knowledge set for economists;
- Expanding and adding more flexibility to departmental electives to give students more depth of economic knowledge;
- Net change of additional 6 credits of required courses for the major.
- The academic requirement will prevent students from double majoring with nearly identical set of courses.
