## **Comments/Notes**

Students from all academic majors can pursue graduation with Fishback Honors College distinction. View the Honors program requirements.

As part of the Political Science major, 18 credits must be upper division coursework. At least 3 of the 18 credits must be non-U.S.

As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
- a capstone course in their major
- a designated diversity, equity, and inclusion course AHSS 111 (or AIS 211 for teaching specializations students only)
- minor, second major, or teaching specialization

Testing into a higher-level language course may reduce time to graduation.
