No course currently exists. The new course is designed to meet credentialing requirements that were adopted by the Association for Play Therapy in July of 2019. For students and practitioners who want to become a Registered Play Therapist, they need to complete this course. The credentialing body for the registered play therapist announced revised education and training requirements which included a system of phases that must be completed. Within each phase, individuals must complete a combination of education hours plus experiential hours in play therapy. The addition of this course allows for completion of the Phase I experiential hours in a supervised environment. CHRD 711 will provide a structured environment for novice clinicians to practice play therapy and receive faculty supervision.
