2.2. Add justification for all changes noted above:

The applied practice experience is a practicum-based course where students complete projects at public health practice settings supervised by a preceptor. There is no lecture-based content in the course. Therefore, an instructional method of internship/practicum matches the course delivery method. The course activities and assessments are better suited to a satisfactory/unsatisfactory grading method compared to a standard letter grade. Preparation for the capstone project will no longer be a component of the practicum courses as it is being moved to a new course. This change will allow for increased instructional content on research design and

methods to better prepare students for the capstone. Because of this change, the reference to the capstone project has been removed from the course description.
