The proposed course focuses on two specific types of research that are important to public and population health: dissemination research and implementation research. Other courses with instruction on research in the health sciences were found, but none focused on dissemination and implementation research. PHA 758 gives students exposure to inpatient clinical research focused on quality improvement; this course does not have a population health focus. NURS 840 teaches research methodologies that are useful in health promotion research with underserved populations but does not include dissemination and implementation research.
