7. Explanation of the Change:

The proposed changes make the minor an 18 credit minor with no prerequisites, instead of 18 credits plus 6 credits of prerequisites. Because of the decrease in number of credits, elimination of the extensive list of electives with “topics” to choose from possible. For non-Ness School majors, the net effect is elimination of 6 credits needed to complete the minor, and increased flexibility in the courses that can be chosen. For Ness School majors (Agricultural Business, Business Economics and Entrepreneurial Studies), the selection of starred elective courses allows these

students to now receive the minor as it is no longer automatically embedded in their major requirements.
