The proposed course will combine the material previously covered in ARCH 352 Architecture Studio I (5 cr.), ARCH 452 Architecture Studio III (5 cr.), ARCH 492 Topics in Architecture, (3 cr.) with material primarily from ARCH 422 Media Tech V (2 cr.) as well as some from ARCH 461 Building Shop (2 cr.) to reduce the content to two repeatable courses to enable instructional synergies such that topical areas will not require multiple introductions and repetitions.

ARCH 654 Research Studio (5 cr.) and ARCH 654L Research Lab (2 cr.) are part of a coordinated vertical set of sections each fall semester that will include students from the third, fourth, and graduate levels.
