### Comments/Notes

Students from all academic majors can pursue graduation with Fishback Honors College distinction. View the Honors program requirements.

As part of the Global Studies major, students in this program must complete/earn:

- GLST 401, Global Cultures and Identities. It is required and offered every third semester. Students must have junior standing to enroll. Completion of the required cross-cultural experience is recommended prior to enrolling in GLST 401.
- a minimum of 12 credits from the Global Studies electives lists in World Cultures/Societies, World Economics/Geography, or World History/Politics; 2 different prefixes minimum; No more than 6 credits per prefix; No more than 3 credits of lower division coursework credits (100-200 level courses)
- a cross-cultural experience outside of the United States (study abroad or international internship) that includes at least 3 academic credits and lasts at least 4 weeks. This requirement can be completed during the summer or academic year. Students may select several shorter experiences that add up to four weeks with approval from the Coordinator of Global Studies and/or Director of the School of American and Global Studies. All students must work with their academic advisor to determine an appropriate cross-cultural experience.

As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete/earn:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
- a capstone course in the major
- a designated diversity, equity, and inclusion course AHSS 111 (or AIS 211 for teaching specialization students only)
- a minor, second major, or teaching specialization
- 6+ credits of Modern Foreign Language coursework, including completion of the 202-Level
