As part of the History major, students in this program must complete:

- one of the six upper division elective courses must be from the following designated diversity focused electives: US History choices – HIST 349, HIST 367, HIST 368, HIST 373, HIST 462, HIST 471; OR World History choices – HIST 402, HIST 415.
- all major classes with a grade of C or higher

As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete/earn:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
- a capstone course in their major
- a designated diversity, equity, and inclusion course – AHSS 111 (or AIS 211 for teaching specializations students only)
- a minor, second major, or teaching specialization

Testing into a higher-level language course may reduce time to graduation.
