- 18 upper division major credits, including at least 3 non-U.S credits.
• all major classes with a grade of C or higher

As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
• a capstone course in their major
• a designated diversity, equity, and inclusion course – AHSS 111 (or AIS 211 for teaching specializations students only)
• a minor, second major, or teaching specialization
