## 8. Explanation of the Change:

Given the workload demands of faculty, especially those related to teaching, it is no longer feasible to require students to complete an independent study. Independent studies have to be negotiated between the faculty member and the immediate supervisor, assuming the independent study can be fit into the workload. It is often the case that a faculty member has no additional workload space to accommodate an independent study. Removing the independent study from required to elective will help the students with minor completion as it eliminates the time spent identifying a faculty member and having the faculty member negotiate workload with the immediate supervisor. Replacing the independent study with a class from the electives will expedite time to completion for those students who do not wish to complete an independent study. The program will still have the independent study as an elective option, but recognize that this will be an option only in unique cases when a faculty member has workload space available.
