PART-TIME & WORK-STUDY JOBS

Both the SDState campus community and Brookings community offer numerous part-time job opportunities to students who want a source of income to put toward college and other living expenses. Here are a few things to know as you start to explore your options for working while attending school.

WORK-STUDY

This type of financial aid is awarded to qualifying students who complete a FAFSA. Work-study students have the opportunity to earn money by working a part-time job on campus. Students who are awarded work-study are responsible for obtaining employment by searching for work-study eligible positions on Handshake, the online job site provided to students by the Career Development Office, or on the South Dakota Department of Labor & Regulation (DLR) website. Some jobs are open only to students who have been awarded work-study. Before applying for work-study only jobs, verify for your eligibility with the Office of Financial Aid.

PART-TIME JOBS

Students searching for part-time jobs, including those that are work-study eligible, have several resource options:

Handshake. Provided by the Career Development Office at sdstate.joinhandshake.com/login. Use your MyState username and password to sign in using the blue Sign On button. Please note: To access your Handshake account, you will need to allow seven business days after you have registered for classes. Questions? Email Careers@sdstate.edu. **Part-time Job Fair.** Each fall the Career Development Office and South Dakota DLR co-host a free parttime job fair for all students. More than 40 campus and community employers attend with the goal of meeting and hiring student-employees. This year, the fair will be held August 29 from 3:00-5:30pm in the Union VBR.

SDSU CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The Career Development Office at SDState assists students from their first year through graduate school. In addition to major and career exploration and preparation services, the office helps connect students to campus, community and regional employers who have available opportunities for seasonal, internship and entrylevel positions. Throughout the academic year, the office also coordinates several additional job and internship fairs that are specific to academic majors and career interests. BILLING & PAYMENT

Students will be able to view their bills a few weeks prior to classes starting. Once detailed billing statements are posted, an email notification will be sent to students' Jacks accounts.

BILL PAYMENT

Bills must be paid in full in the second week after classes start each semester. Due dates can be found at sdstate.edu/recordsregistration/class-schedules.

SDEPAY

The electronic billing and payment system for SDState. Students access SDePay through Student Account Self Service on mystate. sdstate.edu and can:

Spring 2024: January 18

- Pay their SDState bill by eCheck (free) or debit/credit card (2.85% fee)

PAYMENT PLAN

[sdstate.edu/cashiers-office/payment-plan]

Students can elect to enroll in an interest-free payment program, which allows them to make monthly payments each semester. A persemester enrollment fee of \$45 is required to set up a payment plan.

REFUNDS

If a student's financial aid and/or scholarship package exceeds the final bill, a refund will be issued. Direct deposit for refunds can be set up through mystate.sdstate.edu under the Student Account Self Service portal.

WHERE CAN I FIND MY FINANCIAL AID & BILLING INFORMATION?

- 1. Log in to mystate.sdstate.edu.
- 2. Go to your Dashboard.
- 3. Select "Student Account Self Service" for billing-related information and functions or "Financial Aid Self Service" for financial aid information and functions.

Students can view and pay their bill using SDePay.

Clicking the "SDePay" link in the Student Account Self Service portlet will direct you to the billing site.

Students may also add authorized payers to access SDePay through this site.

FINANCIAL AID PROCESSING

Federal financial aid is awarded to eligible students who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available at studentaid.gov. **The SDState school code for FAFSA is 003471.** Students whose FAFSA information does not reflect their current financial situation should contact the Financial Aid Office to discuss options. Students can view their financial aid offer including scholarships, grants, work-study, and loans on the Financial Aid Self Service portal in their MyState account.

FEDERAL DIRECT LOANS

First-year students generally qualify for a total of \$5500 in Federal Direct Loans. Students who have financial need will receive a combination of Subsidized and Unsubsidized Direct Loans. Students without financial need will be offered Unsubsidized Direct Loans only.

The Direct Loan interest rate for the 2023-24 school year is fixed at 5.50%. Unsubsidized Direct Loans accrue interest from disbursement. Interest on Subsidized Direct Loans begins six months after the student graduates or drops below half-time enrollment status.

In order for Direct Loans to be processed, a student must:

- Accept the loans through Financial Aid Self Service in MyState
- Complete a Master Promissory Note (MPN) at studentaid.gov
- Complete Entrance Loan Counseling online at studentaid.gov listing SDState's school code 003471

ALTERNATIVE SOURCES OF FINANCIAL AID

Federal Direct PLUS Loan: A fixed 8.05% interest rate loan available to eligible parents. The maximum amount awarded cannot exceed the cost of attendance minus other financial aid awarded. PLUS loans are disbursed in equal payments for fall and spring.

Alternative Loans [private/non-federal]: These loans typically require a co-signer and have variable interest rates based on the credit of the cosigner. For more information visit sdstate.edu (keyword: private loan).
