Academic Requirements:

Current:

Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in CSC/MGMT 325 - Management Information Systems, FIN 310 - Business Finance, HRM 460 - Human Resource Management, and (MGMT 360 - Organization and Management or AGEC 371 - Agricultural Business Management).

If a student chooses to double major in two majors offered through the Ness School of Management and Economics (Economics, Agricultural Business, Business Economics and Entrepreneurial Studies), the second major needs to have at least 18 credits that are distinct from the first major.

Proposed:

Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in BADM 485 Strategic Management, CSC/MGMT 325 - Management Information Systems, FIN 310 - Business Finance, HRM 460 - Human Resource Management, and (MGMT 360 - Organization and Management or AGEC 371 - Agricultural Business Management).

If a student chooses to double major in two majors offered through the Ness School of Management and Economics (Economics, Agricultural Business, Business Economics and Entrepreneurial Studies), the second major needs to have at least 15 credits that are distinct from the first major.

8. Explanation of the Change:

Removed a specific course selection from SGR #1 and SGR #2 to allow students more flexibility in meeting their System General Education requirements. Clearly indicated ECON 201 Principles of Microeconomics is a required SGR #3 course.

Replace ENTR 485 Entrepreneurial Studies Capstone with BADM 485 Strategic Management as the school moves to a common capstone course for the Agricultural Business, Business Economics, and Entrepreneurial Studies majors.

Revised the program to allow any DSCI prefixed class to satisfy the upper-division electives.

Decreased non-duplicative credit requirement if double majoring from 18 to 15 credits. This is necessary with the move to a common capstone course between the Agricultural Business, Business Economics, and Entrepreneurial Studies majors, which eliminates the capstone as a non-duplicative course.
