PUBH 753 Maternal and Child Health will focus on public health perspectives of maternal and child experiences across the lifespan and will only briefly discuss the role of nutrition in the well-being of MCH populations, whereas NUTR 660 solely focuses on nutrition. PHA 753 Women and Children's Health specifically focuses on medication-related issues for women and children. The purpose of PUBH 753 is to expose students to an area of public health that continues to draw significant attention from the media and the public given the high maternal mortality rates and health disparities that exist. This course will highlight the challenges faced in rural and underserved settings to align with the overall focus of the MPH program.
