Faye and Johanna,

Our faculty that teach graduate education courses in Agricultural Education and Curriculum & Instruction have been discussing the need for a graduate-level student teaching course. Specifically, our need for a graduate student teaching course is for Agricultural Education given that Minnesota has updated their licensing practices for alternative licensed all teachers in the state. Based on the legislation, for teachers to earn permanent certification, they must graduate from a program that has a student teaching component. For context: usually, these students are current Agriculture high school teachers who are already in the classroom who are alternatively certified at a tier 1 license (which is only valid for a year) and are looking to move to a tier 3 license which is considered a permanent license/what are our graduates currently when they transfer their license to MN.

The faculty started paperwork to add a new course, but I noticed that BHSU already offers (unique) EDFN 688 Student Teaching. The course description matches what our faculty are looking for in the graduate student teaching course offering.
Student preparing to teach will observe, participate, and teach under the supervision of the regular classroom teacher in an approved school.

We are not proposing any changes to the course. Would you and your faculty review this request and let me know if you support our proposal to offer this course?
