Current:

Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in ECON 485 - Economics Capstone.

If a student chooses to double major in two majors offered through the Ness School of Management and Economics (Economics, Agricultural Business, Business Economics and Entrepreneurial Studies), the second major needs to have at least 15 credits that are distinct from the first major.

Proposed:

Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in ECON 485 - Economics Capstone.

If a student chooses to double major in two or more majors offered through the Ness School of Management and Economics, each major needs to have at least 15 credits that are distinct from the other major(s).

8. Explanation of the Change:

Added BADM 101 Survey of Business (3 cr.) as a required course, as a foundational knowledge set for anyone with a major in the Ness School.

Re-worded the academic requirements "non-duplicative" wording and removed reference to each program's title in the Ness School.
