An overall GPA of 2.5 is required to enroll in any education courses.

As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete/earn:

Testing into a higher-level language course may reduce time to graduation. To begin coursework above the 101 level, take the free modern language placement test at <a href="https://www.sdstate.edu/school-american-and-global-studies/language-placement-information">https://www.sdstate.edu/school-american-and-global-studies/language-placement-information</a>. Once student passes a higher-level course with a grade of C or better, students can be granted credit for FREN 101 and up to 202 for a nominal fee. Students with any modern language experience are strongly encouraged to complete the placement test and register for the appropriate course according to their language proficiency level.
