Students from all academic majors can pursue graduation with Fishback Honors College distinction. View the Honors program requirements.

As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete/earn:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
- a capstone course in the major
- a minor, second major, or teaching specialization
- a grade of C or better in all major coursework
- 6+ credits of Modern Foreign Language coursework, including completion of the 202-Level

As part of the German major, students in this program must complete 23 major elective credits and select at least 21 upper-division credits. The following is a suggested sequence.

  - o GER 454 Survey of German Literature II 3 Credits
  - o GER 455 German Film 3 Credits
  - o GER 392 & 492 Topics 2-3 Credits (when topics is literature cultures and/or civilization)
