Students from all academic majors can pursue graduation with Fishback Honors College distinction. View the Honors program requirements.

An overall GPA of 2.5 is required to enroll in any education courses.

As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete/earn:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
- a capstone course in the major
- a grade of C or better is required all major coursework
- teaching specialization (If a student should choose not to complete the teacher specialization, an additional minor or major will be required for graduation with a German major.)
- 6+ credits of Modern Foreign Language coursework, including completion of the 202-Level

As part of the German major, students in this program must complete 23 major elective credits and select at least 21 upper-division credits. The following is a suggested sequence.

Testing into a higher-level language course may reduce time to graduation. To begin coursework above the 101 level, take the free modern language placement test at https://www.sdstate.edu/school-american-and-global-studies/language-placement-information Once student passes a higher-level course with a grade of C or better, students can be granted credit for GER 101 and up to 202 for a nominal fee. Students with any modern language experience are strongly encouraged to complete the placement test and register for the appropriate course according to their language proficiency level.
