As part of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
- a capstone course in their major
- a minor, second major, or teaching specialization
- 10 + credits in Natural Sciences including two lab science courses and courses in at least two prefixes

As part of the History major, students in this program must complete 18 elective credits within one of the following emphases. A maximum of 6 credits from a non-History prefix will be accepted towards the elective requirements. All major classes must earn a grade of C or higher.

The History program requires students pursuing a major to complete a practical skill development experience through completion of an internship or field experience placement. In the event that students who for some reason cannot complete an internship or field experience or have a specific reason otherwise such as graduate program preparation, the school will require them to complete an additional upper-level history course.

Testing into a higher-level language course may reduce time to graduation.
