As part of the College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences, students in this program must complete/earn:

- a minimum of 33 upper division credits (300-400 level courses)
- a capstone course in their major
- minor, second major, or teaching specialization
- a grade of C or better required in all major coursework
- 6+ credits of Modern Foreign Language coursework, including completion of the 202-Level

As a part of the Spanish Major, students in the program must complete 21 technical elective credits as detailed below.

- 21 credits total are required from the following 3 elective categories; distribution will vary for the Humanities and Professional Emphasis
- 15 of the 21 elective credits must be at the 300 and 400 level
- In total, 24 of the 36 credits required for the Spanish major must be at the 300 and 400 level
- See Catalog for course lists
- Advanced Language/Linguistics: 3-6 credits
  - Minimum of 1 course is required for the Humanities Emphasis
  - Minimum of 2 courses are required for the Professional Emphasis
- Literature and Culture Electives: 6-12 credits
  - Minimum of 3 courses are required for the Humanities Emphasis
  - Minimum of 2 courses are required for the Professional Emphasis
- Applied and Experiential Learning Electives 0-9 credits
  - \*No courses from this category are required; however students can draw from this category OR the previous categories (Advanced Language/Linguistics & Literature and Culture) in order to complete their remaining elective credits for a total of 21 credits.

Testing into a higher-level language course may reduce time to graduation. To begin coursework above the 101 level, take the free modern language placement test at <https://www.sdstate.edu/school-american-and-global-studies/language-placement-information>. Students with any modern language experience are strongly encouraged to complete the placement test.
