8. Explanation of the Change:

The School of Health and Human Sciences has requested to change the prefix of CS 282 Customer Service to HMGT. The CS (Consumer Sciences) prefix was used by the previous Department of Consumer Sciences (CS) prior to consolidation of the CS department with the Health and Nutritional Sciences department into what is now the School of Health and Human Sciences. The Hospitality, Tourism and Event Management program utilizes the HMGT prefix and has been the program responsible for providing the course.

The school has requested to no longer offer CS 377 Professional Documents (1 cr.). The school engaged in a process to evaluate each academic program’s curriculum, course management, and program productivity metrics as part of their strategic enrollment plan. As a result, programs that have required CS 377 have determined that the student learning outcomes attached to the course can be sufficiently integrated into other required courses.

The remaining request is to change the current major requirement of CA 230 Consumer Behavior (3 cr.) or LDR 210 Foundations of Leadership (3 cr.) to require only LDR 210. The student learning outcomes (SLO’s) from LDR 210 are better aligned with the program’s SLO’s.
