NURS 440 and NURS 434 are both nursing theory courses, however, each focus on unique concepts and exemplars which are different from the proposed course. NURS 440 focuses on end of life care and chronic disease processes. NURS 434 includes health and illness concepts focusing on complex patients and childbearing families. The proposed course will focus on complex illness, traumatic injury, and disease management. Additionally, NURS 434 is part of the current BSN curriculum and will remain in place until currently enrolled students finish and then this course will be terminated.
